Asthma Basics


The American Lung Association's online learning module, Asthma Basics, provides a free, in-depth look at how to accomplish better asthma



The purpose of the Asthma Educator Institute is to build the skills and capacity of healthcare professionals to treat and manage individuals with Asthma, while at the same time prepare eligible candidates to successfully pass the National Asthma Educator Certification Board (NAECB) examination to become a Certified Asthma Educator (AE-C). Up to 14.0 CEU/CME credits are available.

Goal:

 Less severe asthma and fewer respiratory problems for adults with asthma, quit tobacco when possible

Timeline:

5-year initiative spanning 21 states




Medication Chart - Back


